



Looking back on 2009

BIG FISH and COOL WEATHER...

...that best describes another exciting season at Budd's Gunisao Lake Lodge, where our fishermen continue to keep us on the map as the

#1 Walleye Destination in Canada.
Believe it or not, after registering 224 Master Angler walleyes in 2009, Gunisao Lake more than doubled any other lake for the number of walleyes over 28 inches caught & released! And



28 inches plus gets your name on "The Walleye Wall". Our largest walleye, a 33 ¼ inch whopper, was caught by Colorado's Josh Clarine. With walleye fishing at the top of most fishermen's list, our

Northern Pike got to lie around and take a break most days to gain some length and weight too. After having our best northern pike year ever at Gunisao Lake in 2008 with 68, our fishermen caught 34 Master Anglers over 41 inches. The biggest northern pike was caught by Chuck Chaffee from Indiana at 44 ½ inches.

Most Canadian camps opened late in 2009 because of heavy ice and snow. We're very lucky to be on a lake that opened up on time on May 19th. While this summer's lodge weather included some very cool temperatures, walleye fishing wasn't affected much.



With ice on most lakes and rivers, we made it to Walleye Hole to bring in the lunkers. In the13 days fished in May, 78 Master Angler walleyes were caught. As we moved into June, we waited for the weather to warm up. It did for a few days, even hitting the 90 degree mark. Then it dropped back down and stayed there till the end of July. Most warm years we are swimming in front of the lodge by the end of June, but not in 2009. It was very common to see 65 degrees on the depth finder even in July. This all changed once we hit our warmest week of the year in August. Unfortunately for our guests, we closed down Aug. 1st. Our pilot Adrian and one of our guides, Mike Stewart, made up for the hard to find Northern fishing by catching 12 master angler pike in two days of fishing. In 2010, we'll be staying open till August 9th to make sure we don't miss out on this great fishing.



We're dedicating this first issue of the "Walleye Wall" to our great fishermen that have made the Master Angler board at the lodge. Many of our guests have had the distinct experience of getting their name on

"The Board" and over the years many of them have had their names listed more than once. This year was no exception for multiple entries. Tom Hooper, John Schwan, John Ostdiek, Steve Cochell, Nathan Griffith, Joanne Robertson, Greg Kvilhaug, and Adrian Warden all caught 4 or more Master Anglers this year. A number of other guests, including Wendy Stallings, Gunner Sikorski, Richard Creasy, Jim White, Jerrod Ellis, Kory Schwan, Dave Guckenberg, Matt Bachman, Glenn Carlisle and Jason Simard caught 3 Master Anglers. Gunisao Zake FISHING TIPS

Jigging for walleyes on Gunisao Lake



There is not much to a jig and frozen minnow, so how do they catch so many walleyes? Some people say color has a lot to do with it, but I am not one of those people. I stick to a standard white with an eye on it. If I don't have one available, I use whatever is in my tackle box. After color, I look at my length of hook. A longer hook is sometimes better to attach your frozen minnow to. If the walleye is just nibbling, they can take the minnow right off the hook if it is not long enough. As many of our fishermen know, a standard hook is good enough at Gunisao Lake. The weight of the jig will depend on

how windy it is, how deep you are fishing, and how fast the boat is moving. A very calm day might only require a ¼ oz. jig while a windy day at the same depth might require ½ oz jig just to get to the bottom. After determining what jig to use, you should next concentrate on presentation. Presentation is described here as a two step process.

Step #1 - Take the time to hook your minnow the right way. I believe the "right way" is to hook your minnow through the mouth, through the gills, and then twist the jig a half turn and put the end of the hook back through the belly and out the back while pushing the minnow up near the ball of the jig. This will ensure the minnow will stay on the hook and give good presentation in the water. It also gives more of a hook for the fish to bite rather than just hooking through the head of the minnow.

Step #2 - Find the bottom of the lake. In most cases, you want to get your jig to the very bottom and bring it up 3 to 6 inches. This is very important so the fish can see the lure and take the lure in the fish's mouth. If you are vertical jigging, you can just drop it down to the bottom and lift up on your rod to get the correct height off the bottom. If you are trolling, you need to let enough line out to get the desired height. Trolling is much more difficult to keep the same height off the bottom, so you want to be within a foot of the structure you are fishing. The wind, depth, and trolling speed will tell you how heavy of a jig to use.

As many know, Gunisao Lake has a lot of days where "catching" rather than fishing is the norm. But for those tough days, I hope these tips help. Check out more Gunisao Lake fishing tips on our website at www.WalleyeManitoba.com. - Dusty Budd

Fishing with Mike Stewart

After 10 years of guiding on Gunisao, there is no question spring is a good time to fish. The fish are shallow and easy, and after a long winter fishermen are as eager as the fish. By late July, however, it's like anglers have turned their thoughts to other things. That's too bad because when July turns to August in the north there is a touch of fall in the air. Time for Gunisao's overlooked bite.



This is probably the best time for a pike-walleye combo trip. The walleye fishing is not as fast as in the spring, but the trade-off for a few less numbers is that the fish are definitely heavier. The walleyes move back shallower on the reefs and points where a jig usually gets it done. As in summer, weather plays a role in how good the walleye bite is. Great weather can create a great bite, but when the walleye are not biting like you would like, all you have to do is switch to pike.

Pike fishing at Gunisao is at its peak in late summer. The pike move into the cabbage weeds that grow along the islands and the shore. Unlike being limited to a few bays, like in the spring, you have many more spots to try. Some spots are big, others might only require a few casts to cover. Since the weeds are thick, it is advisable to use a medium heavy outfit. Baitcasters are best, but beefed-up spinning gear will also handle the fish and the larger spoons, plugs, & spinners.

By mid-August some poplars will be thinking about turning yellow, the cabbage will be starting to thin, and the fish will definitely be on the bite. With a more active bite and heavier fish, more fishermen need to start taking advantage of late July and Aug. fishing. 
